STANDING COMMITTEES

Clark County Fire Risk Management Group

Commissioner Bartel shared updates from the January 6 Risk Management Group meeting. The same officers will continue for 2021. The 2021 accident & sickness policy rates are available. Notified that MacIIvannie Insurance has joined Nicholson & Associates.

Fairgrounds Fire Facility Board

Commissioner Johnson summarized the January 13 FFFB meeting. FD6 Commissioner Collins is the 2021 Chair. Looking to upgrade several external doors to the key card system used by CCSO to improve building security. FD6 is removing engine 151 from the bay. It will be surplussed and sold following their driver academy. Chief Nohr advised that the costs to upgrade will shared with CCSO. Working with CCSO and FD6 on compatible system options as FD6 also has a facility key card system. A CFFR reserve engine will be placed at the facility. FF Colby Gratzer (St22) asked which apparatus would move to St151. Chief Nohr advised that operations is reviewing options. Commissioner Chunn advised the two boards still need to meet to discuss the future of response operations at the facility. Chief Nohr shared that a joint meeting is planned to occur once we are able to resume in-person meetings to facilitate better discussion.

STAFF REPORTS

Admin Services

DVC Yager summarized the summarized the December Administrative Services report. Discussed current hiring process. Thanked Captain Kays' assistance in managing our EMS supplies while on light duty assignment.

Operations

DVC Peeler reviewed the December Operations report. Reported on recent incidents of interest. Call volume compared to a year ago a bit less due to COVID and eliminating the response to unknown injury calls on the freeway. Discussed employee Covid exposures, positive tests and their impacts on staffing.

Community Risk Reduction/CARES

DVC Jackson detailed the December CRR and CARES program reports.

District Secretary/Chief

Chief Nohr covered the December Chief's report. Provided an update on CCFR personnel COVID vaccinations. 40 of 55 FTE personnel have or are getting the vaccination series. Public Health is reviewing options to get a more wide spread distribution to the public. Commissioner Bartel asked if the County is doing anything to address the potential of riots. Chief Nohr advised there is no credible information on any issues in our area therefore no specific plan is in place. Shared the need to catch up on signatures on the adopted minutes and resolutions of the past year. Will connect with the Board members to coordinate. Have met with City of Woodland officials to discuss the plan to transfer of assets following the annexation. Chief Nohr will be consulting with legal counsel on this matter.

Advised the new Local 3674 Officers are Brian Brault, President and Josh Brooks, Vice President (representing the CCFR unit).

Video of the new Pierce engine build will be shared on the District's Facebook page. The engine is complete and enroute from the factory to the dealer facility in Springfield, Oregon for final tweaks prior to delivery.

IAFF LOCAL 3674 CONTRACT – BC UNIT

The last BC contract expired December 31, 2020. Noted several minor adjustments and incorporation of the interim MOUs in new contract. Comps were not reviewed, but a provision has been incorporated that if the firefighter unit receives more than 1.5% above COLA in their new contract, we will revisit compensation. Discussion. Chief Nohr recommended approval of the two-year contract (term January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2022). Motion to approve the contract by Commissioner Bartel. Second Commissioner Town. No discussion. Call for the vote.

2021 LTGO BOND

Chief Nohr summarized the current rate environment and purpose of the proposed bond. Bond Counsel Scott McJannet of K&L Gates (attending virtually) shared that this bond is virtually identical in form to last year's resolution and contains a not-to-exceed provision. Chief Nohr advised that two engines will be ordered before February 1 before a 3% price increase is implemented. Discussion. Motion by Commissioner Bartel to adopt Resolution No. 210114-1, a resolution authoring a bond not to exceed \$1,700,000. Second Commissioner Ayers. Commissioner Chunn commented that like Chief Nohr, he generally has great reservation on borrowing, but our capacity for debt is high and the rates are low. No further discussion. Call for the vote.
